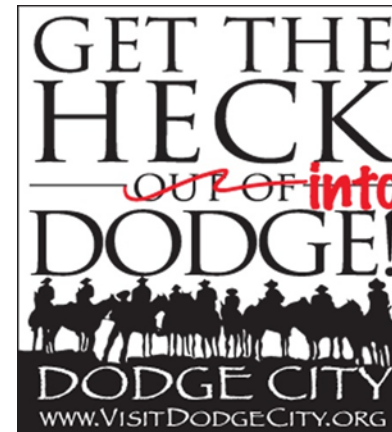

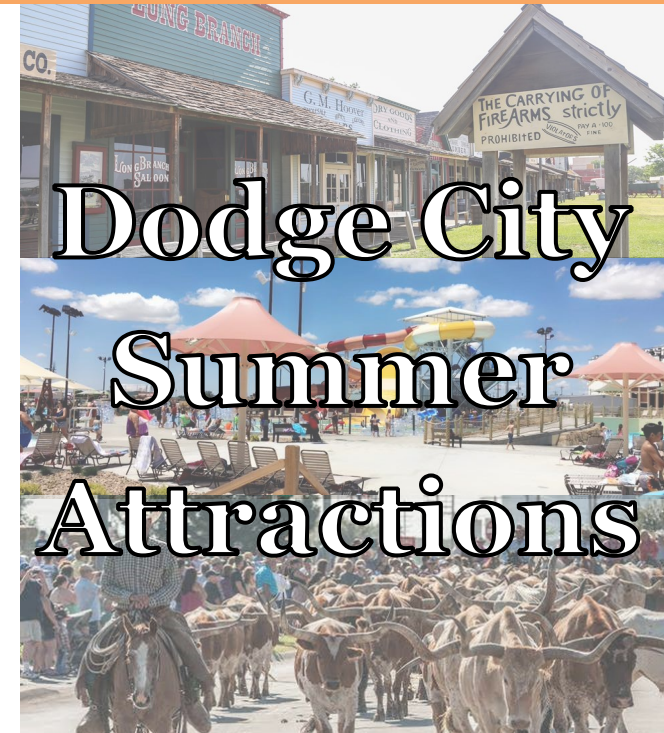
Wyatt Earp Sculpture
