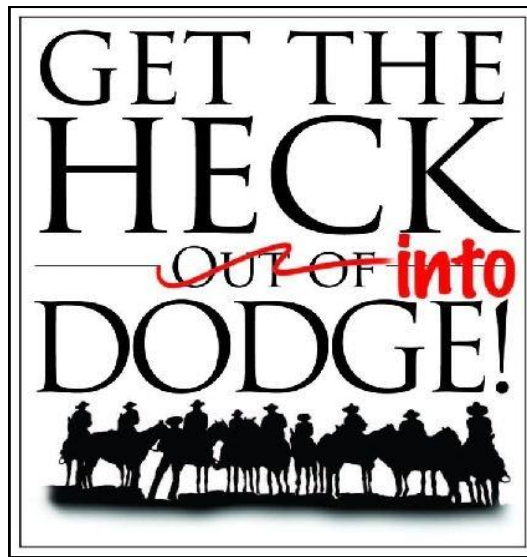

VISITOR CENTER: While in Dodge City, your group will want to take a break at our Visitor Information Center, located at 400 W. Wyatt Earp Boulevard. Our knowledgeable staff can answer any of their questions about Dodge City. Public restrooms are here for a pit-stop on the tour.

Kansas law prohibits anyone younger than 21 years of age from purchasing, serving or consuming alcoholic beverages. Alcohol is sold on Sundays in restaurants and lounges.

TRANSPORTATION SERVICES

Dodge City Regional Airport (DDC): One airline serves Dodge City. They have direct routing to major areas, daily, and connecting international service. Numbers listed are for reservation and flight information.

AMTRAK: Daily service is available on the Southwest Chief.

*Eastbound to Chicago arrives at 12:27a.m. and departs at 12:34 a.m.

*Westbound to Los Angeles arrives at 5:25 a.m. and departs at 5:30 a.m.

The Dodge City station is run on a volunteer basis. When volunteers are available, the train station opens one hour prior to the train's scheduled arrival. The volunteers will remain in the station until the train departs. Tickets cannot be purchased at the station but can be purchased on-line or through a travel agent.

SUGGESTED ITINERARIES

DAY 1 - Late Afternoon Arrival:

4:00 p.m. Go shopping at one of our western specialty shops.

Out West - Western and Native American specialties. They also offer tack, boots, western clothing and western decor.

Longs - A wide selection of western clothing, hats, boots, belts and belt buckles.

4:30 p.m. Arrive at your hotel to freshen up.

***5:00 p.m.** Load up and leave for Moore Ranch (45 minute drive just south of Bucklin)

6:15 p.m.:

Arrive at the Moore Ranch for a **chuck wagon dinner and ranch experience!** Enjoy an evening of life on the ranch with local entertainment. Dig into some delicious homemade chow with all the trimmings. Then watch longhorn cattle being driven over the range to corral them for the evening. Get up close and personal with the ranch animals, horses, chickens, and sheep. Wagon rides are also available. A minimum of 35 participants are necessary.

8:15 p.m. Back to Dodge City to try your hand at the Boot Hill Casino & Resort! If you can tear yourself away from the tables, head back to the hotel for a good night's rest!

5:00 p.m. After shopping, arrive at your hotel to freshen up.

6:00 p.m. Enjoy cocktails, dinner, and a show at the state-of-the-art **dinner theater** (Depot Theater Company), located in the restored, historic Santa Fe Depot (which you will tour tomorrow)! The dinner theater productions feature a wide range of comedy, drama, and musicals. **Season:** October – April with some variations during the summer months. **Rates:** vary depending on the type of show. **Contact:** John Stuff, 620-225-1001, PO Box 661, Dodge City, KS 67801. **Reservations are required so please call for available shows and for ticket information.**

DAY 2

8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. → Guided historical tour including stops at the Home of Stone, historical downtown Dodge, the cattle industry and Fort Dodge. Prices vary.

10:45 a.m. → Enjoy reflection and quiet time at **Liberty Garden**. Liberty Garden is a tribute to those who lost their lives in the *9-11 tragedies*. The memorial includes pieces from the *World Trade Center*, limestone from the *Pentagon* and sandstone from the hemlock grove near the site of the *Flight 93* crash in Shanksville, Pennsylvania.

11:15 a.m. → Just across the street from Liberty Garden, a stroll through the **Wright Park Zoo** is always a treat. The zoo is currently home to 125 animals representing approximately 40 species of animals from four continents of the earth. The Zoo is operated by the City of Dodge City and has *free admission*.

12:15 p.m. → Lunch at one of our fine dining establishments. At **Casey's Cowtown Club**, you can enjoy a great local meal surrounded by western art, décor and collectables. A collection of colorful stained glass is on display throughout the restaurant and bar. Or, you may choose **Central Station**, located just east of the Depot in an old Freight House. They even have an old dining car in the restaurant that you can eat in. The food is excellent and they have special pricing for groups. Or ask for other location options

1:30 p.m. → Tour the restored historic *Santa Fe Depot*. The Depot is home to the Depot Theater Company and state-of-the-art theater equipment. This depot, built in 1897, once housed the famous Harvey House Hotel and restaurant. Enjoy stories and history from people who helped keep this historical building alive. The gift shop in the Depot is a great place to pick up something for the railroad enthusiast.

2:30 p.m. → Tour the *Santa Fe Trail*. Nine miles east of Dodge City you can see the most clearly defined rut trails, still visible after almost 150 years. The site is nestled among the gently rolling hills of the Kansas plains, where the breeze moves the grasses and the peace of nature accompanies this enduring piece of unique history. Don't miss the opportunity to see this rare landmark.

***4:30 p.m. →** Enjoy the tour at the *Boot Hill Museum* starting at 4:30, followed by a show and dinner complete with entertainment from Miss Kitty and her can-can dancers (Available in the summer months or by special arrangement only). You can't find cooking this good in any restaurant. Enjoy home cooked food served buffet style, during the summer season, enjoy a gunfight re-enactment, and stay to enjoy a show in the Long Branch Saloon.

The museum includes an extensive gun collection, Native American artifacts and displays on farming and ranching in the area. Also learn about the buffalo hunt, the cattle drives from Texas and learn about some of the famous lawmen who once roamed our streets. Group pricing is available and package deals can include the museum tour, dinner and show at special pricing.

5:30 p.m. Choose from one of our excellent hometown restaurants. For more information, visit www.visitdodgecity.org, and select restaurants. Or hop back on the coach or one of the hotel shuttles available and go to the *Boot Hill Casino & Resort*. At the Casino, you can dine on fine food at *Firesides Restaurant* and try your luck at the tables or the slot machines. Boot Hill Casino & Resort offers a \$200 Reward, in free play, for group leaders who round-up a minimum 25 passengers with minimum four hour bus reservation. Passengers and bus drivers will enjoy \$25 in Boot Hill Bucks, and a \$10 Food Voucher, which can be used at Firesides or The Snack Bar. OTHER THINGS TO ENJOY!

Boot Hill Distillery: Making its home in the former City Hall, Dodge City Police Department and City Jail, tours of the Boot Hill Distillery are available by calling 620-371-6309. "Born from a Barrel, Forged in the Dust", is their motto.

Carnegie Center for the Arts: This building is a former Andrew Carnegie Library. The classic architectural features make it one of the more unique libraries, and now houses art from local and national artists.

Tortilleria Madero: Enjoy watching as homemade flour and corn tortillas are made in our local factory. Sample the fresh products and take some home for you and your family!

Old Dodge Photo Parlor: Take home a memorable keepsake. Troy Robinson takes old fashioned photographs of your group in 1800's clothing!

Immaculate Heart of Mary Church at Windthorst, KS: This gorgeous church built in 1911 is home to beautiful stained glass windows and architectural beauty. A guided tour of the church with complete history is available.

Mueller/Schmidt House – Home of Stone: Listed on the National Register of Historic Sites, this 3 story home was constructed with native stone and features the original furniture shipped to the frontier in the 1880's by its

builder John Mueller. One room is filled with memorabilia of pioneer mothers who lived in Ford County, Dodge City and the surrounding territory. Scarce lumber on the prairie in the 1800's led to homes built of stone. Season: June through August (By appointment the rest of the year). ITINERARIES

Southwest Kansas Day Trips from Dodge City

RURAL SOUTHWEST TOUR

8:30 a.m. → Depart for Big Basin Prairie Preserve/St. Jacobs Well located 35 miles south of Dodge City on Hwy 283 (The terrain to get to the well is rough, but worth a look at the scenery.). The Preserve is 1,818 acres of native grass prairie, open to the public and home to St. Jacob's Well and a herd of bison. Within Big Basin is Little Basin, a circular depression approximately 280 yards in diameter and 35 feet deep. St. Jacob's Well is a small, permanent pond about 84 feet in diameter. A short hike from the parking area brings you to the well. The well has never been known to have gone dry. The bison herd is usually visible from the various gravel roads or view points located in Big Basin. Drive slowly, stay on the gravel roads and do not approach the bison on foot. *Head back north to Minneola, and turn west at the intersection of Hwy 283 & Hwy 160 to arrive in Meade.*

10:00 a.m. → Arrive in Meade & Dalton Gang Hideout.

The Dalton Gang Hideout, formally the home of Eva Dalton Whipple, sister to the infamous Dalton Gang. Eva Dalton came to Meade in the mid 1880's, and was married to J.N. Whipple, a Meade merchant, in 1887. Whipple built the house which still stands at the corner of Pearlette and Green Streets in Meade for his bride. Years after the couple left Meade a deep rain wash covered with timbers and earth was discovered; a tunnel from the house to the barn built into the hillside below. Legend has it the tunnel was used by the gang to come and go undetected by the law. **Cost: \$4 -- Hours: Open year round, Monday-Saturday 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m.; Sunday 1:00 - 5:00 p.m.**

11:00 a.m. → Depart for Montezuma & Stauth Museum North on Hwy 23 to Hwy 56.

11:30 a.m. → Stop for a closer look at the Gray County Wind Farm

East of Montezuma on U.S. 56. Built in 2001, it was the first wind farm in the state. Its 170 wind turbines, covering nearly 20 square miles, are designed to gather energy from wind and convert it into electricity. Each tower is 207 feet high and weighs 147,000 pounds; each blade is 77 feet in length and weighs 3,300 pounds. All in all, it's an amazing sight. For more information, see the kiosk at the outlook point just off the highway.

1:00 p.m. → Tour Stauth Museum

Located in Montezuma, Kansas, the Stauth Memorial Museum features the travel adventures of Claude and Donald Stauth, long-time residents of Southwest Kansas. Journey with Claude and "Donnie" as you stroll through the permanent exhibit 'Around the World'. Browse colorful displays of handicrafts and arts from every corner of the earth. Experience famous sites and everyday places from around the world through video and slide programs based on the Stauths' trips. **Cost: Suggested donation \$1 per person. Hours: Tue-Sat 9-12 and 1-4:30 Sun 1:30-4:30; Closed Mondays and major Holidays.**

2:30 p.m. → Depart for Cimarron east of US Hwy 56 to Hwy 23 north.

2:45 p.m. → *Tour Forget-Me-Not Farms*

Located south of Cimarron, this dairy farm offers tours for all ages. On your tour of Forget-Me-Not Farms you will get to see everything from our cows being milked on the carousel, to milk being loaded onto the trailers. You'll get a birds-eye view from our viewing areas and finish everything off with some milk and ice-cream sandwiches! **To schedule a tour contact:** Forget-Me-Not Farms at 620-855-2844, <http://forget-me-not-farms.com/>

Directions:

From Cimarron (intersection of Highway 50400 and Highway 23):

1. Take Highway 23 South approximately 4 miles to R Road.
2. Turn East on R. Road and travel 4.5 miles to the entrance of FMNF.
3. Stop and Weigh in at Scale house*.
4. Proceed North on West side of Dairy facility to Commodity area and you will be given unloading directions.

From Highway 56 (intersection of Highway 56 and Highway 23):

1. Turn north and proceed on Highway 23 approximately 8 miles to R. Road.
2. Turn east on R. Road and travel 4.5 miles to the entrance of FMNF.
3. Stop and Weigh in at Scale house*.
4. Proceed north on west side of Dairy facility to Commodity area and you will be given unloading directions.

4:00 p.m. → *Stop for a look at Cimarron Crossing Park.*

South Main, just north of the Arkansas River Bridge. In 1822 William Becknell, “father” of the Santa Fe Trail, first traveled what would become the trail’s Dry Route, or the route heading straight south to the Cimarron River. Although it was the most direct passage to Santa Fe, it was the most dangerous section of the trail. In 1878 Cimarron was settled and named for the Dry Route’s destination. Historical markers for the Santa Fe Trail and a map of the route can be found in the park.

4:15 p.m. → *Take a break at Clark Pharmacy*

U.S. 50 and Main. A pressed tin ceiling, a 1920’s soda fountain, tile counter, and shiny spigots create an old-fashioned ambience to this full-service pharmacy. (620) 855-2242

4:45 p.m. → *Depart for Dodge City.* US 50 Highway east 18 miles

5:00 p.m. → *Arrive at Hotel to freshen up*

6:00 p.m. → *Boot Hill Museum, Depot Theater Company, OR Boot Hill Museum.* Dinner and gaming at the **Boot Hill Casino & Resort**, a dinner theater production at the **Santa Fe Depot** and the **Depot Theater Company**, or dinner, gunfight, and show at the world famous **Boot Hill Museum**.

LIBERAL & GARDEN CITY TOUR

8:30 a.m. → *Depart for Liberal-* south Hwy 283 to Hwy 54 west to Liberal

10:00 a.m. → *Arrive in Liberal and Tour Dorothy’s House & Land of Oz.* Guided tours available through Dorothy’s House and the Land of Oz with Dorothy herself. Dorothy’s House is a farmhouse built in 1907 and is set up to show how Dorothy from the “Wizard of Oz” would have lived in the 1930’s. The Land of Oz is 5,000 square feet of animated entertainment including the Scarecrow, the Tin Man, the Cowardly Lion and Toto. Dorothy takes the tour through different scenes of the movies while telling her story. The tour ends in an Oz Memorabilia room complete with the original model of Dorothy’s House used in the 1939 filming of the movie. 567 E. Cedar, Liberal, KS (620) 624-7624

Located in the historic two-story Larabee Home, the museum features a horse's bit left from Coronado's expedition in 1541 while searching for the fabled "Seven Cities of Gold." Collections tell the story of the settlement of the territory.

12:30 p.m. → Tour Mid-America Air Museum

Located in the heart of America, the Mid-America Air Museum boasts the fifth largest collection of military and civilian aircraft in the United States. Liberal, once home to a major Beech Aircraft manufacturing facility and a B-24 Liberator pilot training base during World War II, established the museum to help preserve a proud local and national aviation heritage. It is a vision started by Colonel Tom Thomas, Jr., who has donated his personal collection of over 50 planes to the museum. The museum houses one of the country's finest hands-on aviation science exhibits, hosts special events like air shows and an aviation camp, presents guest speakers, and features aerospace education programs for students in its 200-seat theater. 2000 W. The museum features permanent and revolving exhibits, community programs, educational tours and extensive research facilities. The permanent displays include: Spirit of the Plains, C.J. "Buffalo" Jones: Last of the Plainsmen, Take Stock in Finney County, and The Sugar Beet Factory. The museum grounds feature the Pleasant Valley One-Room Schoolhouse c. 1890, and the Fulton House, the 1884 home of William D. and Luticia Fulton, plus charming flower and herb gardens. 403 S. 4th Street; (620)272-3664

3:30 p.m. → Tour Lee Richardson Zoo

Go on safari right in Garden City! The Lee Richardson Zoo offers beautiful grounds and fascinating creatures from all over the globe. Over 350 animals are displayed within the 47-acre grounds. The zoo is designed for fun, learning and discovery and is accessible by foot, car or bicycle. ***Pedestrians are admitted free, while nonmember vehicles pay a \$10 admission fee.*** From huge elephants frolicking in their pool to the tiniest of birds flitting like jewels through the lush aviary, the zoo offers a wonderful variety of species. Visit the Wild Asia exhibit, featuring Asian plants, architecture and animals like the Bactrian camel, siamang, red panda, and the beautiful but powerful snow leopards. Don't miss the newly completed Kansas Waters Exhibit. 5:00 p.m. → Depart for Dodge City. US Highway 50 east.

RED LIGHT DISTRICT: Came from railroaders leaving their lanterns in front of the brothels.

- Dodge City lies on the 100th Meridian, a geographical line one hundred degrees of longitude west of Greenwich.
- Five flags have flown over the area south of the Arkansas River that remained part of the Spanish territory. (French, Spanish, Texas, Mexico, and US)
- The largest employer in Dodge City is Cargill, the largest beef processing facility in the world!
- Only one woman was buried on Boot Hill. "Squirrel Tooth" Alice Chambers was buried on May 7, 1878.
- The original Front Street burned down twice, in 1885 and 1886.
- At peak capacity, more than 12,000 head of cattle are processed in Dodge City's two packing plants each day.
- The cow to person ratio in Ford County is 6:1. That's six cows to every person!

DODGE CITY ATTRACTIONS

Cowboys with six shooters strapped to their hips, dancehall girls in brightly colored fashions, stagecoach rides through downtown... a picture from the Old West? As travelers from all over the world discover each, this picture still exists in Dodge City, Kansas.

Dodge City, the real city that is portrayed in movies and television programs, continues to be a popular tourist attraction for visitors traveling through the Midwest. Tourists visit **Boot Hill Museum**, see live gunfights and variety shows in the **Long Branch Saloon**, try their luck at **Boot Hill Casino & Resort**, take walking tours of **Old Fort Dodge**, enjoy a hands-on approach to ranch living at **Moore Ranch**, stroll along the **Santa Fe Trail**, ride the **Dodge City Trolley**, and tour the **Home of Stone**, an 1881 house museum complete with authentic pioneer furnishings. But that's not all!

BOOT HILL MUSEUM & HISTORIC FRONT STREET

Old Dodge City (a.k.a. Boot Hill Museum and Historic Front Street) is an accredited western town history museum located on the original site of Boot Hill Cemetery in downtown Dodge City. Life in the 19th century is interpreted through audio-visual programs, townsfolk in period costume, exhibits, a reconstruction of Dodge City in 1867 restorations and living history demonstrations. Exhibits in Boot Hill Museum include an extensive old west gun collection, Boot Hill Cemetery where unfortunate victims of the early days of lawlessness were buried, Fort Dodge Jail, one of several original buildings at the fort still in existence, a one-room school, and the 1878 Hardesty House, a restoration of a Victorian era cattleman's home.

Established in 1947, ***Boot Hill Museum has over 60,000 objects, photographs, and documents.*** The Museum has obtained these over its lifetime from donations and a limited number of purchases. Most of the items date from Dodge City's early days in the 1870's through the 1920's, and most belonged to the original residents of Dodge City. Many items were acquired by Boot Hill Museum from the Beeson Museum when it closed in 1964. The Beeson family began acquiring much of their collection in the late 19th century, starting with Chalkley, an owner of the original Long Branch Saloon. His sons, Merritt and Otero, continued collecting and opened the Beeson Museum in the 1930's. Originally housed in the basement of the family home in South Dodge, it was later moved a few blocks to South Second. Both Beeson Museum buildings no longer exist.

From Memorial Day to Mid-August, visitors enjoy two gunfight re-enactments each day.

Other 19th century business exhibits include a general store, cigar store, dry goods store, barber shop, two saloons, drug store and doctor's office, hardware store and saddlery, gunsmith, printing office, railroad depot and blacksmith. Entertainment at the museum is daily during the summer season. Special arrangements can be made during the off-season. Some of the summer activities include: stage coach rides, gunfights, the Long Branch Saloon Variety Show featuring Miss Kitty and the can-can dancers.

OLD FORT DODGE & FORT DODGE CEMETERY

Six miles east of Dodge City is the site of Old Fort Dodge, founded to help protect a long section of the Santa Fe Trail. It served as a supply post and base of operation against the warring Indians from 1865 – 1882. It was removed from service in 1882 and now serves as the Kansas State Soldier's Home. Several original buildings remain, including the commanding officer's quarters, enlisted men's barracks, and the post hospital. All the structures were built of limestone quarried north of Dodge City by civilians and soldiers. Both civilians and soldiers were buried in the military cemetery. The saying was "the rich are buried at the fort and the cowhands and unknown were buried on Boot Hill or gone to hell."
